Good Morning Laurie,

Well this is a nice surprise! We can chat either by phone or Zoom on Monday or Wednesday next week if you'd like. Just not Tuesday. I can send a Zoom link later.

I'm an amateur genealogist working on my third family history. This book will be about my maternal great grandfather's journey from Finland to the UP in 1890. According to an obituary clipped from the Escanaba Daily Press (dated 1946), Matthew Mattson Winberg traveled to Michigan in 1890, "coming directly to Thompson. For a few years he was employed in woods and mill-work at both Manistique and Thompson" before returning to Finland in 1893 to find and marry a wife. He eventually came back to Munising in 1895 and homesteaded some 80 acres in Chatham in 1904.

Since I have few direct artifacts about Matt, I thought it would help the book if I could find news articles from that period that mention Matt or any of his relatives (he had a relative--either an uncle or cousin--who sponsored his trip to America) or would describe the kind of life he might have had during that first three-year-period.
